





Many programs evolved over the last 3 decades since and we see the connection between animal abuse and other human victims", said Claudine Wilkins.

In order to move forward, we must look back and see where we came from. Realizing there was a serious lack of information available to professionals, ALS published copyrighted online "toolkits" which provide summaries of animal law and cruelty topics. These toolkits evolved since 1996, when our founder began getting questions about "what to do in a case involving an animal". Since then, thousands of these toolkits were created and the demand for resources continues.

Join our efforts to continue teaching nationally and throughout Georgia on many animal law issues, including animal cruelty, neglect, animal fighting, abandonment, animal hoarding, puppy mills, large impound cases, equine cruelty, dangerous dogs, dog bite, K9 Handlers, the link between animal abuse and other crimes (domestic violence, human trafficking, drugs, gangs, illegal gambling & weapons, serial crimes, etc.).

In 2006, the Georgia State Dog Fighting law passed. Other legislation protecting animals resulted in the passage of many state and local laws occurred over the last two decades. In 2009, Claudine petitioned the State Bar of Georgia for the creation the Animal Law Section, a "mainstream" section ensuring attorneys have high-quality resources available in animal cases.
